Emergency

An emergency is where the police are needed immediately. This can be when a crime is in progress or when somebody and/or their property are in immediate danger. For deaf people in the event of an emergency, you can contact us by calling **01522 558263** or **558140** or via mobile/text **07761 911287**. Non-emergency

Use this number if you need to contact the police for an incident that is not an emergency - for example, if your car has been broken into whilst you have been shopping. You should also use this number for all internal departments or general enquiries.

Crimestoppers

If you have any information about crime, call Crimestoppers anonymously. Crimestoppers is a registered charity, independent of the police. Crimestoppers is only interested in what you know, not who you are. You won't be asked your name and your calls will not be recorded.

IN YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD...

This report outlines the way in which the Authority and the Force have worked together to develop and improve services for the communities we serve, at a time of significant change for policing throughout the country. The Authority has driven an innovative programme, including a ground-breaking partnership with the private sector that has earned praise from the Policing Minister. The partnership was successfully concluded as we oversaw a Force that was solving more crime and reducing the overall level of crime in Lincolnshire.

Following the retirement of Richard Crompton as Chief Constable, the Authority moved quickly to ensure continuity and stability with the appointment of Neil Rhodes as Chief Constable. Neil has served as Deputy Chief Constable for the past three years and has played a prominent role in the Authority's search for a strategic partner.

Cutting crime and ensuring the safety of the public are our priorities. These have always been at the heart of what we do, and we remain committed to building on the positive and productive connection with our communities. Last year, to

maintain strong performance and enhance delivery, we simplified the Force structure. This has already led to considerable improvements. Also, we have worked hard to increase the number of officers allocated to Neighbourhood Policing, without compromising the service we provide in other, less visible, areas of our business.

Funding cuts in the Government's Comprehensive Spending Review meant the loss last year of 70 officers. Our strategic partnership with the private sector will produce savings of an estimated £28million over the next decade, bringing new investment into the Force and, crucially, helping to minimise the loss of more police officers.

Potentially, regional collaboration offers more savings and an improvement in operational resilience. We are already seeing the benefits of our partnership with neighbouring forces, with the use of regional teams to help with our fight against major and serious organised crime.

We are preparing for the arrival of an elected Police and Crime Commissioner in November. The Commissioner will take over the role of the Police Authority.

Together, we take pride in being able to hand over a Force that is in good shape, performing well, and with plans in place to continue to meet the challenges that undoubtedly lie ahead.
