EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND PURPOSE OF REPORT

The Police & Crime Commissioner is asked to sign a Section 22A Collaboration Agreement in relation to the Modern Slavery Police Transformation Fund. The purpose of the agreement is to create a national team led by a Lead Force which shall be responsible for supporting the NPCC Modern Slavery Lead to improve the police response across England and Wales to Modern Slavery. The agreement is made pursuant to Section 22A of the Police Act 1996 (as amended) and is made between the Police Chiefs and PCCs of the forces named therein.

The key objectives of the S22A agreement are to set up and define the functions and responsibilities of a national team to be set up to assist in delivering national work in tackling Modern Slavery. The team has its own designated budget with freedom to operate within the boundaries of the Agreement. The team is led by a host force. The S22A agreement describes the governance of the team, accountability and direction and control arrangements, funding arrangements and matters relating to assets.

A2. LINKS TO POLICE AND CRIME PLAN AND PCC'S STRATEGIES/PRIORITIES

The functions of the Modern Slavery Police Transformation Fund Programme, as outlined in the Section 22A Collaboration Agreement fully support the Police and Crime Commissioner's Community Safety, Policing and Criminal Justice Plan for Lincolnshire April 2017 to March 202, in particular the key principle of "protecting and supporting victims and the vulnerable".
