

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND PURPOSE OF REPORT Prisoner Intelligence Notification System (PINS) is a software solution designed to help law enforcement agencies prevent crimes committed by offenders when they are released from prison. PINS notify local police and agencies in advance of the release of offenders who can then be managed and supported as they re-enter the community. Nottinghamshire Police has acted as the Lead Force procuring the system for Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire and Northamptonshire for a period for 2 years from 1 st September 2018 to 31 st August 2020.

A. NON-CONFIDENTIAL FACTS AND ADVICE TO THE PCC

A1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

1. The forces within region entered into a memorandum of understanding in 2014, where they agreed to procure and fund a regional integrated Prisoner Intelligence Notification System (PINS). The East Midlands Region including, Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Northamptonshire and Lincolnshire is currently on a PINS 4.3 two year contract, with 60 concurrent users shared within the region.
2. This paper is to support the procurement for a further 2 years from 1st September 2018 to 31st August 2020 which is a cost of £25,319.93 for Lincolnshire Police. The budget for this has already been provisioned via the CPT.

A2. LINKS TO POLICE AND CRIME PLAN AND PCC'S STRATEGIES/PRIORITIES

The forces using PINS consider that this assists in improving the effectiveness and efficiency of the forces. The system allows forces access to information about the release of offenders which enables appropriate management and support to be undertaken.

B. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Lincolnshire Police will pay its financial contribution to the Lead Force (Nottinghamshire Police) of £25,319.93 for the two year period of the contract. The budget for this has been provisioned through CPT.

C. LEGAL AND HUMAN RIGHTS CONSIDERATIONS

Nottinghamshire Police is the lead force and therefore they have agreed to ensure that they have all the legal rights and consents necessary to enable all the parties to use PINS, the information systems and networks are approved and continue to have approval for connection to PSN Protect, all personnel who require or have access to PINS are appropriately vetted and that arrangements and safeguards are in place to ensure that information stored by each force is managed appropriately.

D. PERSONNEL AND EQUALITIES ISSUES

Nottinghamshire Police shall host PINS on its information communication systems in accordance with the Supplier Contract and shall be responsible for managing the Supplier Contract in accordance with the terms and conditions of the refreshed MOU.

There is no requirement for any additional staff and/or officers in order to use the system or to introduce the system as this is an extension of an existing contract/supplier.

E. REVIEW ARRANGEMENTS

This is the continued purchase of a system which has been used within the regional forces for a number of years. The system will be updated during this two year period and therefore new functionality will become available. The contract will be reviewed at this point and again at the end of the two year contract. At that point this is an option to extend the contract further.

F. RISK MANAGEMENT

All parties have entered into a separate agreement (The RIAA) on 13th May 2015 setting out the basis on which those involved may share, access and store information belonging to each other (this relates to information assurance including Freedom of Information, confidentiality, Data Protection, Data Security and Risk Management).

G. PUBLIC ACCESS TO INFORMATION


